**Solemn Novena 2024** begins on Monday 5 February, and continues until Tuesday 13 February, with sessions daily at 11:00am, 1:10pm and 7:30pm (Sunday 10:30am, 12:30pm, 3:00pm and 6:00pm). Full details of this year's novena are on the Cathedral website: https://www.galwaycathedral.ie/novena.

Celebrations This Week — Feasts of St Brigid, abbess, secondary patron of Ireland (1 February), and the Presentation of the Lord (2 February); memorial of St John Bosco, priest (31 January); optional memorials of St Aidan, bishop (30 January; a feast in the Diocese of Ferns), St Blaise, bishop & martyr (3 February), and St Ansgar, bishop (3 February). Bl. Margaret Ball & Francis Taylor, martyrs, may be celebrated as an optional memorial on 30 January in the Archdiocese of Dublin and the Diocese of Meath. St Thomas Aquinas, priest & doctor of the Church (28 January), is not celebrated this year as the Sunday takes precedence.
