Celebrations this Week — Feasts of St Catherine of Siena, virgin & doctor of the Church (29 April), and Ss Philip & James, apostles (3 May); memorial of St Athanasius, bishop & doctor of the Church (2 May); optional memorials of St Pius, pope (30 April), St Joseph the Worker (1 May), and St Conleth, bishop (4 May; a feast in the Diocese of Kildare). St Peter Chanel, priest & martyr (28 April), and St Louis Marie Grignon de Montfort, priest (28 April), are not celebrated this year as the Sunday takes precedence.
