CATHEDRAL NEWS

Solemnity of St Nicholas — On Friday next, the Cathedral Choir joins the choir of St Nicholas' Collegiate Church to celebrate our joint patrons with a service of vespers: this takes place in St Nicholas' Church at 8:00pm, and Bishop Michael Duignan will also be in attendance.

First Friday & Saturday — Next Friday and Saturday are the first of the month; Communion will be brought to the sick and housebound on Friday, and on Saturday there is mass and office of Our Lady at 11:00am.

A Capella Knights give a concert in the Cathedral on Saturday next, 7 December, at 7:45pm, with all proceeds going to Hand in Hand Children's Cancer Charity. Further details, and a link to tickets, are on the Cathedral website.

Remembrance Tree Mass — The 6:00pm mass on Thursday 5 December will be offered for all those whose names have been placed on the remembrance tree.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is this year transferred to Monday 9 December, due to 8 December falling on a Sunday, and is a holy day of obligation.

Live Crib — The annual live crib takes place on Thursday 12 December, between 11:30am and 4:00pm.

Carol Service — The annual Christmas carol service takes place on Thursday 19 December at 7:30pm, led by the Cathedral Choir and with Bishop Duignan presiding.

Diocesan Family Services Collection — Last Sunday's collection realised a total of €947.17, for which we are very grateful.
