Peace Mass — The annual mass for world peace, celebrated by Bishop Duignan, takes place at 11:00am on new year's day, Wednesday 1 January.

Unwanted Christmas Gifts — In the days after Christmas, unwanted non-perishable gifts may be left in the box beside the crib for donation to Cope.

Eucharistic Adoration resumes today after the 12:30pm mass.

Holy Year of Hope — The opening of the 2025 Holy Year is marked at the 10:30am mass today.

First Friday & Saturday — Next Friday and Saturday are the first of the month; Communion will be brought to the sick and housebound on Friday, and on Saturday there is Mass and office of Our Lady at 11:00am.

Christmas Dues Envelopes are available at the doors of the Cathedral – if you are in a position to allow us to claim tax relief on your donation, please return it before tomorrow (30 December). We greatly appreciate your support.

The Offertory Collection last Sunday came to €2,540.98, for which we are very grateful.

Celebrations this Week — Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God (1 January); memorial of Ss Basil the Great & Gregory Nazianzen, bishops & doctors of the Church (2 January); optional memorials of the Holy Name of Jesus (3 January), and St Munchin (Mainchin), bishop (3 January; a feast in the Diocese of Limerick). St Thomas Becket, bishop & martyr (29 December), is not celebrated this year as the Sunday takes precedence.

Galway Cathedral Choir always welcomes new members.

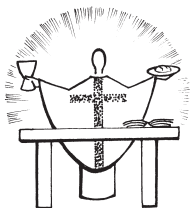
Rehearsals are on Tuesdays at 7:30pm, and the choir sings at the Sunday 10:30am mass.
