## **CATHEDRAL NEWS**

**Divine Mercy Sunday** is celebrated in the Cathedral today, with devotions at 2:00pm and mass at 3:00pm.

**First Friday & Saturday** — Next Friday and Saturday are the first of the month; Communion will be brought to the sick and housebound on Friday, and on Saturday there is Mass and office of Our Lady at 11:00am.

**The Offertory Collection** over Easter weekend amounted to  $\pounds$ 5,545.09, while the Good Friday collection in aid of holy places came to  $\pounds$ 1,364.99; thank you very sincerely for your response to these collections.

St Asicus, bishop (27 April), is not celebrated this year as the Sunday celebration takes precedence.
